A timely reminder:

Earlier this month we had a fouled board that deprived 3 tables of bidding and playing a 7 Diamond or 6 No Trump contract. Please minimise the chances of fouling a board by following the rules (Rule 7C). After you agree on the number of tricks scored in a contract, shuffle your original thirteen cards and restore them to the pocket corresponding to your compass position. Please refrain from any other actions (e.g., postmortems) that might create an opportunity for a fouled board.

Winning at Pairs and Teams

Now that Teams sessions are a regular feature of the Club play, here are a couple of handy hints from the ABF's website: https://www.abf.com.au/education/tactics/

Winning at Pairs (Matchpoints)

You receive a "top" (score) if your result is better than that of any other pairs sitting in the same direction. It's not the actual score that counts, but the number of pairs you beat.

Winning at Teams (IMPs)

This is a different story altogether to pairs. Here you are usually trying to beat just one team at a time, rather than a large number of other bridge players. Make your contracts safely, bid thin vulnerable games. Playing a steady game and making fewer mistakes than the opponents should see you winning at teams.
